
# LATOS BOARD MEETING REPORT By Mark Herman, Secretary

The most recent LATOS board meeting was held at the York Theatre in the Highland Park neighborhood of Los Angeles. The famous Bob Baker Marionette Theater recently signed a 10-year lease to renovate and occupy the theatre, which originally housed a 4-rank Wurlitzer organ, and later went on to become home of the Artisan Organ Company in the 1950s and 60s.

Since LATOS was gifted a large 4-manual Allen theatre organ by the Jack Darr estate, countless venues have been explored to seek a good home for this magnificent instrument in a public venue. Luckily, we now have one. By unanimous vote of the board, we agreed to place the organ in the new Bob



Baker Marionette Theater in Highland Park. This vibrant group of artists holds organ music as an important element in their shows, even using George Wright records to accompany acts. When the LATOS opportunity presented itself, they redesigned the plans for the new theatre to place the organ in a featured spot where it can be used as part of their shows, as well as for concerts and



silent films. As part of their busy production schedule, they bring in countless school groups each month, all of whom we can now introduce to theatre organ through this exciting new partnership. The agreement was vetted by attorney (and organist!) Jelani Eddington, and we now will wait for approval from the Bob Baker Board of Directors. The board unanimously approved up to \$2,000 to relocate the organ into the space, and the Bob Baker organization is covering costs for electrical and to create space for organ chambers.

Treasurer Bill Campbell reported that we have \$55,951.76 in our checking account and we discussed ways to raise more funds. Our membership count is currently at 116 memberships (not counting associate/household members), and Kevin Cartwright made a motion that we pass a resolution to begin a membership drive for the 2019-2020 season to greatly increase our membership (which has suffered high attrition over the past decade). The motioned carried with a unanimous vote

In other news, the bylaws committee (chaired by yours truly), is nearing completion on a comprehensive bylaws revision, which should be ready within a month or two.
