## VINTAGE CARTOON FESTIVAL

The 5th Annual Vintage Cartoon Festival was another resounding success orchestrated by Old Town Music Hall and animation historian Jerry Beck. Guests were treated to festive piano music by Edward Torres in the theatre arcade as we gathered for the show. At showtime, Edward fired up the organ with a spectacular rendition of "The Merry-Go-Round Broke Down" accompanied by a vintage piano roll on the Bösendorfer. The energy kept flowing with a medley of "Wake Up and Live," a Disney duo of "When You Wish Upon a Star" and "Whistle While You Work," a cameo of the spirit of Ethel Smith with a rousing rendition of "Tico Tico," and the medley closed with "It's A Small World After All" in a diverse array of musical styles.

Jerry Beck introduced each of the films we were to see during the screening, and to our delight the first film was a silent short to be accompanied by Edward Torres. Edward brought an early Felix the Cat short to life in "Felix in Hollywood," a delightful tale of Felix's attempt to make it big in Tinseltown. Many thanks go out to all who helped setting up this fine organ over the past several months.


