I first met Mark in 2016, when I heard him play at the Cleveland ATOS convention on the Armory Organ. I was entranced by Mark's meticulous technique, wonderful harmonic sense, but beyond that, a smile that would melt anyone's heart. We made friends that day. A while later, while Mark was playing at the Shanklin Music Hall, which is in my "neck of the woods," we arranged for Mark to revoice my Allen Lyn Larsen LL324, as he was also an Allen dealer at that time. We spent two wonderful days together, further cementing our friendship. Of course, I attended the Pasadena convention, which Mark expertly arranged and first played the Bandrika Fox Wurlitzer for our enjoyment. But, it was his performance at Shea's Buffalo last year that for me brought him to the absolute highest level of musicianship. We had Mark over for dinner that night, and we couldn't have seen a happier person, for good reason!



While so many artists have been unable to cope with this unprecedented challenge, Mark has risen to the occasion with determination and total aplomb. His fledgling broadcasts at Nathan Barr's, Bandrika, came through his iPhone Even with the limited fidelity, we could once again experience that great instrument in such capable hands. But rapidly Mark mastered the art of the on-line broadcast, which has reached a level of refinement that in many ways exceeds a live performance. Now we can see Mark playing from different camera angles, which is a treat for those of us (me included!) who try to play better ourselves. The audio fidelity has improved significantly, which I believe is at least in part Mark's doing. Deepest appreciation is due also to the many individuals who own these fantastic instruments for making them available for Mark to play. Without Mark's energy, I am sure many of these places and their fine organs would not be heard by so many of us. Finally, if "Nature calls," all we, as listeners, have to do is press the "pause" button and answer that request, and then return for more great music with no treasured-musical-moments missed.

I must emphasize that those of us who enjoy these broadcasts have a responsibility to do our part, large or small, to help fund Mark's efforts. These contributions, as Mark has set it up, are purely voluntary. I sure hope his many listeners have answered that most gently posed request.
