Wilshire Ebell Grant

Congratulation LATOS! A grant in the amount of \$34,000 for work on the Wilshire Ebell Theatre Barton 3/13 console rebuild and relay upgrade project has been awarded by the ATOS Endowment Fund Board of Trustees and approved by the ATOS Board of Directors.

The Barton was originally installed in the National Theatre, Milwaukee, Wisconsin in 1927. In 1965 the organ was removed from the theatre and was in the hands of an organ buff. In 1977 it was refurbished by Junchen-Collins Organ Corporation of Woodstock, Illinois for an Organ Grinder Restaurant in Canada. That restaurant never opened. The Barton was purchased from storage by Burton A. Burton, owner of the Casablanca Fan Company, and was transported to South Pasadena and eventually donated to LATOS. The connection was made to install the Barton in the Wilshire Ebell Theatre and replace the theatre's small Robert-Morton. The Barton three manual console and its 10 ranks of pipes were installed with an additional three ranks of pipes in 1987.

The rebuild and upgrades will make the Barton reliable, more flexible, easier to move on stage, and more available for use for LATOS functions. Also, the theatre will benefit from the upgrades and be able to demonstrate the organ at their convenience.

Thank you ATOS for these funds to make a highly visible chapter theatre organ more available and heard by more future theatre organ fans.
